2025 Mentored Pilot Study Program

Applications Open

The School of Public Policy, University of Maryland, Baltimore County sponsors an annual *Mentored Pilot Study Program* in the field of retirement, health and disability research through their Retirement and Disability Research Center (RDRC). This RDRC program provides grant support to doctoral students to pursue pilot studies focused on retirement, health and disability, with funding from the U.S. Social Security Administration (SSA). The goal is to encourage doctoral students to conduct pilot studies that could lead to external funding to conduct further research focused on disability, retirement and health.

The Mentored Pilot Study proposal must address one of SSA's 2025 research focal areas:

Focal Area 1: Understanding Service Needs and Improving Service Delivery
Focal Area 2: Studying Causes and Inequities of Overpayment and Underpayment
Focal Area 3. Addressing Barriers to Disability and SSI Programs Participation and Processes
Focal Area 4: Understanding and Improving Communication
Focal Area 5. Identifying Disparities by Race, Ethnicity, and Sex
Focal Area 6: Examining Economic Security of Program Applicants and Beneficiaries
Focal Area 7: Addressing Employment Barriers for People with Disabilities

Pilot Study Funding

Two \$8,000 grants will be awarded to doctoral students to conduct disability, retirement or health pilot studies, intended to lead to external funding support. They will be matched with a mentor from among the UMBC RDRC research faculty.

Submission

Applicants should submit a one-page concept paper that provides a brief outline of the pilot study, the target funder for the pilot study, and a timeline. The proposed work should be completed within a 1-year time frame. The submission should also include a discussion of what the grant funding will support.

The Training and Education Committee will review applications – assessing for relevance to the RDRC and SSA goals, overall feasibility and within the proposed timeline and likelihood of a high-quality data for a grant submission.
